Interest "Interest" refers to a property interest, such as a fee simple or life estate. However, the RAP doesn't apply to such simple interests as these, since they normally vest immediately (we'll get into that later). Rather, there is a certain kind of interest to which the RAP applies: future interests.

The rule that provides that certain future interests must vest, if at all, within 21 years after the death of a life in being at the time that the interest is created. Of all the rules that never developed with regard to limiting the ability to transfer property, the one with the strongest ramifications today is the Rule Against Perpetuities.

In property law and real estate, a future interest is a legal right to property ownership that does not include the right to present possession or enjoyment of the property. Future interests are created on the formation of a defeasible estate; that is, an estate with a condition or event triggering transfer of possessory ownership. A common example is the landlord-tenant relationship.

To survive a Rule Against Perpetuities analysis at common law, the person conveying property had the burden to show—upon conveyance—that the future interest was certain to vest or fail within this "vesting period." If the grantor does not convey his entire interest in the property, then he retains a future interest. For instance, in Example 1, the grantor gives a life estate to C, and then the property goes to D, but only if D survives C.If D does not survive D, then the property reverts back to the grantor, or to the grantor's estate if he died, since someone must own the property.
