Behavioral Goals may be placed in an IEP when it is accompanied by a Functional Behavioral Analysis (FBA) and Behavior Improvement Plan (BIP).An IEP that has behavioral goals should also have a behavioral section in the present levels, indicating that behavior is an educational need.

Behavior Goals for Individual Education Plans
IEP Behavior Goals. If you are writing goals and objectives related to behavior/compliance, you will want to make sure that your goals are based on the student's past performance and that they are stated positively. Behavior goals must be relevant to the student's needs and should provide replacement behaviors for the maladaptive behavior.

Setting behavioral IEP goals for a student with a disability often poses a challenge for educators because behavior(s) of concern may change more frequently than reporting and/or goal review requirements under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).

Addressing Behavior Needs in IEPs - VBISD
It is the responsibility of a special education student's treatment team to develop appropriate academic and behavior goals for the student's Individualized Education Plan, otherwise known as an IEP. Within the IEP is the Behavior Intervention Plan, which is referred to as the BIP 1. The BIP addresses specific behavioral issues.

Meaningful Goals... Focus on acquiring skills by addressing what the student WILL DO, not what they won't do. *If a dead man can do it, it's not behavior* Consider what you will SEE at the end of the IEP year. Focus on the outcome. Poor Example: Mary will decrease the number of times she blurts out

Goals Measurable Social/Behavior Writing Meaningful and
Target Goal - Conflict A situation of conflict in any school setting By (date), when given a situation of conflict in any school setting, the student will independently perform non-conflict provoking behavior (e.g., walking away, ignoring, seek assistance), improving conflict avoidance skills from 0/10 opportunities in ten consecutive trials to 8/10 opportunities in ten consecutive trials.
